## Who Should Apply?

Applicants must be Affiliate Members in good standing for at least one year and have been in the stained glass field or equivalent professional practice for a minimum of three years.

Professional classification is open to Glass Studios, Artisans, Retailers, Teachers, and Galleries.

### **Application Fee**

There is a separate \$100 application fee for each professional classification for which the studio wants to receive. Each Application for Professional Membership must be submitted independently for each classification.

#### Required Business Documentation

#### **Quality of Work**

#### Letters of Recommendation

- Recommendation letters from two (2) clients, with projects completed within the last four (3) years
  - Client interviews may be conducted by Membership Credentials Committee prior to the panel interview
- Letter of support from one (1) current Accredited Professional member
- Letter of support from one (1) current Professional Member (or a second Accredited Professional member)

#### Membership Credentials Committee Interview

- A panel of Accredited and Professional members will meet with the applicant to discuss one or more of the Applicant's projects presented in their portfolio.
- Applicants will be asked to provide knowledge of various glass techniques used in their projects, as well as working knowledge of SGAA's best practices for design, fabrication, installation, health and safety.

### \*Portfolio of Studio Work Requirements:

Submit five (5) high-quality project samples completed within the last 3 years.

o Portfolios should be in PowerPoint, PDF, or equivalent format, and submitted as an attachment to Professional application.

### Artisan / Studio applicant must include in Portfolio:

- The portfolio should include at least one (1) image of a design rendering (e.g., a colored sketch) along with a photo of the completed project.
- Original design project description should include the architectural settings, individual window, and detail photo(s), location, size of project/window(s), completion date, and a brief description detailing any other special considerations or challenges.
- Restoration projects should also include the original fabrication studio (if known), the original windows' age, the restoration completion date, a brief description of the restoration work performed, description of the window failure/damage and how these problems were resolved.
- Applicants will be asked to share their philosophy in their approach to art glass projects.

#### Retailer applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Images of retail space with corresponding details for the storefront, square footage of shop, location (if multiple), and a brief description detailing any other special considerations.
- Portfolio must include inventory summary; indicate the top ten (10) selling products.
- Narrative of business plan and retail offerings, including but not limited to stained glass supplies, tools, and materials, and/or finished products.
- Applicants will be asked to share their philosophy and convictions in their approach to glass.

## Teacher applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Class syllabus that include details following standards and guidelines for industry best practices, and notes as well as dates, dates, times, and student attendance (numbers).
- Tell the story of at least one (1) class / workshop though photos and text that includes thematic content, unique design, fabrication, installation problems and/or solutions, particular types of glass used and why, etc.
- Applicants will be asked to share their philosophy in their approach to learning the glass crafts.

## Gallery applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Portfolio of glass artists represented by the Gallery, including duration of relationship.
- Images of gallery space with corresponding details for the storefront, square footage of display, location (if multiple), and a brief description detailing any other special considerations or services offered.
- Prospectus for a Call for Glass Art, including photos and text that includes thematic content, particular types of glass, display problems and/or solutions, and why, etc.
- Applicants will be asked to share their philosophy and convictions in their approach to promoting the work of glass artisans to the public view, whether contemporary or historical.
