Thank you for your interest in becoming an Accredited Professional Member of the Stained Glass Association of America (SGAA). Accreditation is the SGAA's highest level of recognition and represents excellence in craftsmanship, ethics, and business practices. This application is intended for experienced studios and individuals who have consistently produced outstanding stained glass work and demonstrated leadership in the field.

### Who Should Apply?

Applicants must be Professional Members in good standing for at least two years and have operated a stained glass studio or equivalent professional practice for a minimum of five years.

Accreditation is open to restoration studios, preservation studios, architectural art glass studios, and independent artists and designers.

### **Application Fee**

There is a separate \$200 application fee for each professional accreditation classification for which the studio wants to receive. Each Application for accreditation must be submitted independently for each classification.

## Details of **Application** Requirements:

#### Required Business Documentation

- FEIN / IRS letter
- Sales Tax ID#
- Commercial Business and/or Contractor's license (not applicable for Artist/Designer)

#### Insurance Documentation

- Current certificate of insurance (COI)
   providing proof of insurance for general
   liability, and care & custody of property of
   others in transit and in the studio (Bailley
   Insurance, Inland Marine, etc.)
- Worker's compensation insurance (as applicable)

#### Acceptable Proof of Studio Safety Standards

- Description of Studio Safety Policy
- Description of Safety Training Program

#### Quality of Work

- CV / Resume for Studio (maximum 5 pages)
- Resume for each key employee (maximum 2 page each, as applicable)
  - o studio owner
  - o studio director / manager
  - lead artist / designer
  - o field installer, etc.

#### Sample RFP Response

- Sample RFP response is specific to the Accreditation in each application:
  - Restoration / Preservation Studio
  - Architectural Art Glass Studio
  - Artist / Designer
- Membership Credentials Committee will review the RFP response and evaluate quality and alignment with established industry best practices.

#### <u>Portfolio of Studio Work</u> (maximum twenty (20) pages)

- See specific details (below \*) for each accreditation classification.
- Submit 10 high-quality project samples completed within the last 4 years.
- Include architectural context, project details, and high-resolution photos.
- Portfolios should be in PowerPoint, PDF, or equivalent format, and submitted as an attachment to Accreditation application.

#### Sample Studio Contract

- Terms and General Conditions
- Include details for process and scope of work understanding

#### Letters of Recommendation

- Recommendation letters from five (5) clients, with projects completed within the last four (4) years
  - Client interviews will be conducted by Membership Credentials Committee prior to the accreditation interview to verify site and safety practices
- Letter of support from two (2) current Accredited Professional members

#### Membership Credentials Committee Interview

- A panel of Accredited Professional members will meet with the Applicant to discuss one or more of the Applicant's projects presented in their portfolio.
- Applicants will be asked to provide knowledge of the SGAA's best practices for health and safety, design, fabricating and installing stained glass windows in North America (or applicable jurisdiction or country).
- Applicants will be asked to provide knowledge of various glass techniques used in their projects.

### \*Portfolio of Studio Work Requirements:

Submit ten (10) high-quality project samples completed within the last 4 years.

Portfolios should be in PowerPoint, PDF, or equivalent format, and submitted as an attachment to your application.

#### Restoration / Preservation Studio applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Projects submitted should clearly illustrate and document the before and after conditions of the window(s) and site in detail.
- Images should demonstrate the proper use of fabrication and reinforcement techniques, including the applicant's knowledge of leading, soldering, cementing, and support methods in regard to the restoration / preservation.
- The portfolio should include at least one (1) project in which the Applicant either installed or specified EPG (environmental protective glazing).
- Tell the story of at least one (1) project by demonstrating though photos and text the restoration
  process of one or more windows from start to finish that includes the specific restoration problems
  and/or solutions, particular types of glass used and why, etc.
- Applicants will be asked to share their restoration / preservation philosophy and convictions in their approach to projects.

#### Architectural Art Glass Studio applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Projects submitted should illustrate the applicant's ability to handle significant installations that
  incorporate the main components of architectural glass, including but not limited to fabrication,
  design, and installation.
- Images should demonstrate the proper use of fabrication and reinforcement techniques, including the applicant's knowledge of leading, soldering, cementing, and support methods.
- Tell the story of at least one (1) project though photos and text that includes thematic content, unique design, fabrication, installation problems and/or solutions, particular types of glass used and why, etc.
- The portfolio should include at least one (1) image of a design rendering (e.g., a colored sketch) along with a photo of the completed project.

### Artist/Designer applicant must include in Portfolio:

- Projects submitted must be sufficient to illustrate the designer's knowledge of structure and reinforcement. Images should show detail and overall views demonstrating the proper use of fabrication and reinforcement techniques, including the applicant's knowledge of leading, soldering, cementing, and support methods.
- Tell the story of at least one (1) project though photos and text that includes thematic content, unique design, fabrication, installation problems and/or solutions, particular types of glass used and why, etc.
- Each project should include at least one (1) image of the design (a colored sketch or rendering) along with an image of the completed project.
